## K5 Cooks Up Thanksgiving

I was delighted to spend a couple mornings recording a Podcast with our K5 scholars. We delved the depths of Thanksgiving turkey making, pie baking and thankfulness!

### The Bird:

**Freddy:** Bake the turkey without feathers at 256 degrees for 5 minutes.

**Oliver:** Put it in the oven for 50 minutes at 50 degrees.

**Jack:** Bake the turkey without feathers for 20 minutes in a HOT oven. I don't like turkey skin.

**Cameron:** Bake the turkey without feathers because if you kept the feathers on they would shrivel off. You need a naked turkey to put in the oven at 200 degrees for 2 minutes.

**Antonio:** If you baked a turkey with the feathers on it would taste like feathers. Bake the turkey for 5 or 10 hours at 100 degrees.

## Thanksgiving *(cont. from p.1)*

**Andres:** Bake the turkey with the feathers off for 1 minute.

**Ria:** Bake your turkey on Hot!

**Tommy:** Bake the turkey with feathers off at 10 degrees for like an hour.

**Collin:** Bake a turkey for 10 or 20 minutes.

**River:** Bake a turkey with feathers off at 20 degrees for 60 minutes.

**Zoe:** Bake a turkey without feathers for 14 seconds at 10 degrees.

**Miles:** Bake with the feathers off.

**Maya:** You bake a turkey in the oven for 5 minutes on super hot - like 1,030 degrees.

**Benjamin:** Feathers off for 5 minutes at 5 degrees!

**Naszir:** Feathers off or it will taste nasty and bake for 45 minutes at 1,000 degrees.

### The Pie:

**Griffin:** Mash pumpkins up and put them in a crust.

**Amaira:** Cut the top off the pumpkins and take out what is inside. You put it into bread and bake it for 20 minutes.

**Sam:** You need pumpkin, sugar, eggs, water, and crust and bake it for 30 seconds at 35 degrees.

**Saniya:** The pumpkin for the pie comes from the pumpkin farm!

**Cassidy:** Buy a pumpkin, mash the pumpkin and bake a pie for 20 hours at 30 degrees.

**Kaleb:** Take the top off the pumpkin, scoop out the inside with a spoon and put it in a pie and bake it for 1 minute.

**Callen:** You find some cherries, pumpkin seeds and chocolate and bake it for 40 minutes.

**Jayden:** You dig the seeds out of the pumpkin and put it into a pie and bake it for 30 seconds at 10 degrees.

**Anthony:** I take the pumpkin seeds out, bake the pumpkin and put it in a pie and bake for 14 seconds.

**Miles:** You find a pie in the pumpkin patch!

**Jaiah:** Put sugar, milk, powder, zero, and pumpkin seeds into a pie pan and bake for 10 minutes at 1,000 degrees.

**Andrew:** I am thankful for sports especially baseball and basketball.

**Brooklyn:** I am thankful for turkey and God.

**Jack:** I am thankful for everything.
