Our roots go back more than 100 years, when Roman Catholic Germans, Italians, Poles, and other immigrant groups in Milwaukee established eight parishes and schools in an area from downtown north along the Milwaukee River.

With the passage of decades and the decreasing numbers of students, the single parish schools closed or merged with one another. The five remaining area parishes - Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist, Old Saint Mary, Our Lady of Divine Providence, SS. Peter and Paul, and Three Holy Women actively invest their time, talent and treasure in the one unique Catholic grade school that remains at the heart of Milwaukee's East Side: Catholic East Elementary.

#### **Living Gospel Values**

- Every school day begins and ends with prayer
- Daily religious studies are part of our core curriculum.
- Scholars in grades 2-8 attend Mass weekly while our K3-1st grade scholars plan and attend bi-monthly prayer services. Once a month, 2nd-8th graders walk over to the Holy Rosary campus to attend an all-school Mass with their K3-1st grade buddies.
- Service projects have included monthly visits with residents of the Milwaukee Catholic Home, and food, book and coat drives for local and international organizations.

#### **Kids Campus**

Our before- and after-school enrichment program is directed by certified teachers. Kids Campus is available to scholars who need care daily as well as to scholars who need care only occasionally. Before school care begins at 7AM and after school care ends at 6PM.
